

Class 1 Homework Autumn 2

This year your homework will be in Pick 'N' Mix format. The red activities at the top need to be completed weekly. The green activities are linked to this half term's topic - 'Carnival of Animals'. Children should choose **at least 5** of the green tasks they would like to complete over the half term. They can be completed in homework books or brought into school on Fridays if they are not in the books. Children will have the opportunity to share their homework tasks with the rest of the class on Fridays.

Read at least 3 times per week. Discuss what you have read with an adult by answering questions, retelling the story or recalling some of the information facts in non-fiction books. Please log in your child's reading journal each time they read.	Use Mathletics to practise the key maths skills we have been learning in class. www.mathletics.co.uk Y1 - practise adding and subtracting within 10.	Practise your spellings each week ready for our spelling test on Friday. Reception will receive spellings next term.
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Make an animal puppet and put on a puppet show.	Take a walk around somewhere in your local area with an adult. Take pictures, draw or write about animals you see.	Imagine you were an animal. What animal would you be? Write about and draw what animal you would be and why?
Choose your favourite animal and write/draw about the life cycle of that animal.	Make a 3D model of an animal. This could be out of cardboard, clay, sticks or any other materials you have at home. Go on a shape hunt around your home, garden or local town to see what different shapes you can find. With those shapes, make your favourite animal.	Choose a book about an animal. Read it to an adult and write a book review about your thoughts on the book. You could even ask your adults review of the book and write that too.	Create your own jigsaw. What animals could you include in it? How many pieces could your jigsaw have?
