
# <u>Victorian Britain</u>


#### <u>History</u>

## How you can help at home

- Reading at home with your child can really help their confidence when reading aloud. Whether it be their reading book from school, books or magazines around the home or helping read a recipe when cooking, every little helps! Reading to your child can also help develop their comprehension and enjoyment of reading. You can discuss the stories, what they think might happen next, link events to personal experiences and talk about their favourite characters.
- <u>Spellings</u> will be brought home weekly every Friday and children will be tested on them the following Friday. The words sent home will be linked to those learnt in phonics lessons the previous week.
- <u>Number bonds to 10 and 20</u> please practise these at home with your child whenever possible.
- **2,5, and 10 times tables:** If your child is in Year 1 please practise these at home in preperation for Year 2.
- Homework is an opportunity for children to share the skills and knowledge they
  have learnt in school with you at home and to practise their skills. The tasks will
  be in a 'Pick 'N' Mix' format and relate to our topic. The red tasks should be
  completed weekly and children should choose 3 of the green tasks to complete over
  the half term. Any completed homework can be brought in on Fridays and we will
  share it in class.
