Key vocabulary

<u>Battle</u>: A fight between two armed forces. <u>Normandy</u>: A region in France where William the Conqueror came from.

<u>**King</u>**: A male ruler of an independent state, especially one who inherits the position by right of birth.</u>

<u>**Conqueror</u>**: A person who wins control over a place or people through force.</u>

<u>Knight</u>: A man who served his lord as a mounted soldier in armour.

<u>Key learning</u>

The Battle of Hastings took place in 1066 and was a significant moment in British history. It marked the beginning of Norman rule in England after William the Conqueror, the Duke of Normandy, defeated King Harold II. This event changed the way the country was governed and led to the merging of Norman and Anglo-Saxon cultures. It also influenced the English language and architecture, as we can see from the grand castles and churches built by the Normans.
