After School Care

There are very few parents requesting wraparound care from 4.30pm until 5.30pm and on some evenings recently no pupils have stayed until 5.30pm. In order to meet all the safeguarding and welfare requirements, the school must have a minimum of two members of staff on duty during wraparound sessions. Our current policy states that parents who need wraparound care until 5.30pm need to contact school before lunchtime (12 noon) on the day that care is required. However, in order to establish demand for wraparound provision each day, we are now asking parents to inform school at least 24 hours prior to requiring wraparound care until 5.30pm. This will ensure that staff have prior knowledge of the demand for provision and enable the school to effectively manage and deploy wraparound care staff to other supporting roles within the school. Parents **do not** have to inform school 24 hours prior if they require wraparound care or wish to book an after-school activity until 4.30pm. We will amend the After School policy to reflect the changes.

Before School Care

There is no need to inform school staff prior to attending before school care, which commences at 8.00am until 8.30am.

Governors

We welcome Stephen Chisholm as a Parent Governor to our Governing Body. Stephen is a parent to two children at the school, a boy in year 4 and a girl in year 2. We trust that Stephen will support our governing body in having an important and influential role to play in the life of our school. On Friday 13 February 2026 the school has organised a Valentine's Jumper Day to mark Valentine's Day. Children can come to school wearing a red jumper or a jumper that they love in exchange for £1 donation. At morning breaktime children can enjoy a Valentine's treat - pancakes with strawberries and cream (toast will still be available for those who don't like pancakes!!) All £1 donations will go towards the cost of the treat. Children will spend time during the day engaging in fun activities.

Chatterbox

Chatterbox sessions run by Reverend Eileen Heaney and John Forshaw will take place each Monday afternoon. These drop-in sessions are for individual or small groups of pupils who are struggling with emotions, lack of confidence, are worried or just need someone to talk to. They provide an opportunity for pupils to have a safe place to express themselves. Reverend Eileen and John will also lead collective worship in school on a Monday afternoon
